Sanchez's mission

● Spain's Socialists yesterday kicked off long-awaited talks to form a coalition government, a task seen as impossible unless several political parties drop some major red lines. In a brief speech to representatives of his party, socialist chief Pedro Sanchez announced he would meet with small leftist and regional parties with liberal Ciudadanos today and with anti-austerity Podemos tomorrow.

Cameron deflects criticism from his own party



PRIME Minister David Cameron stood firm yesterday against eurosceptic members of his own party who criticised a plan to keep Britain in the European Union as a

watered down "thin gruel" of broken promises.

The deal, presented by European Council President Donald Tusk on Tuesday, has so far received a warm response from Euro-

pean capitals which must approve it. But at home, it risks reopening a longstanding wound in Cameron's Conservative Party, beset by division over Europe for decades.
