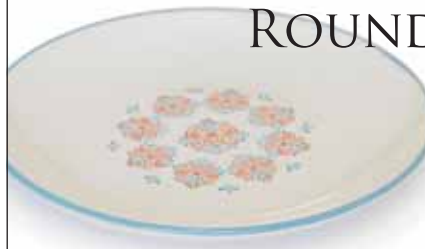

*London.*—A concrete bunker jutting out of sand dunes on the Danish coast, that once was part of Hitler's Atlantic wall, has been re-purposed as part of a new museum that was officially opened by Denmark's Crown Prince Frederik this week. The Tirpitz Museum now hosts exhibitions showing how Denmark's coastline was used by the occupying Germans during the war, as well as revealing other features of the landscape. It was made possible by Ingerlise Helgesen, who lived there when the Germans built the original Tirpitz bunker.

## Council leader quits after Tower criticism

*London.*—Kensington and Chelsea Council leader Nick Paget-Brown has resigned last night following continued criticism of the council's handling of the Grenfell Tower tragedy.

Paget-Brown faced calls to resign from London mayor Sadiq Khan and a number of other senior politicians.

It comes a day after an aborted meeting of the council's cabinet in which leaders had tried to ban members of the public. That decision led to a rebuke from Downing Street yesterday.
