“Beach spills should be probed by the courts”

Palma.—Jaume Font, a former Balearic environment minister when he was with the Partido Popular and now the leader of El Pi, said yesterday that spills of contaminated water are the responsibility of public authorities and should be denounced to the environment prosecution service.

As was revealed last week, the prosecution service has in fact been investigating the circumstances surrounding spills, most notably those at beaches in Palma. Font believes that authorities such as Palma town hall and the government's water agency Abaquia have a duty to be exemplary.

Therefore, if there are spills - without control - they should be investi-



gated and be subject to sanctions. Meanwhile, the parliamentary spokesperson for the Partido Popular, Marga Prohens, yesterday accused the environment minister, Vicenç Vidal, of not knowing how to manage or to invest in order to prevent spills and so therefore the red-flagging of beaches. She referred to all the “lies” (accusations levelled at the PP about covering up spills in the past), stressing that there are more spills than ever and more closed beaches than ever.

Muslim who poses security threat lived in Felanitx

Palma.—The Spanish government's police directorate, which is within the interior ministry, is seeking the expulsion from Spain of Mohamed Attaouil, the vice-president of the Catalonia Union of Islamic Communities.

The directorate considers

him to pose a “genuine threat” to security and that his expulsion - for ten years - is in order to avoid possible terrorist attacks.

It has identified him as being the leader of the Salafi movement in Catalonia; Salafism is associated with strict and puritanical ap-

proaches to Islam and with violent jihad. He is said to be linked to people arrested in other countries who are members of the NGO Revival of Islamic Heritage Society, said to be the principal means of financing Islamic centres for the expansion of Salafism in Europe.
