# Foreign Office Brexit spokesperson, next British ambassador to Spain

**H**ugh Elliott has been appointed Her Majesty's Ambassador to Spain and Non-Resident Ambassador to Andorra in succession to Simon Manley CMG. Elliott will take up his appointment during summer 2019. Prior to his appointment Mr Elliott held the role of Director of Communication and Stakeholders at the Department for Exiting the European Union.

Additionally, between 2013 and 2018 he held a succession of roles at the Foreign and Commonwealth Office including Director of International Agreements and Director of Europe. From 1999 to 2002 he was Head of Economic, Political and Public Affairs of the UK embassy in Buenos Aires. His association with the Government department, however, dates back to 1989. He was previously Head of Government Relations at Anglo American plc, a diversified global mining company, where he worked for nearly 7 years and was responsible for setting up the Government Relations function across the business.

## Prince Harry plants cross at London's Field of Remembrance

**B**ritain's Prince Harry visited a Field of Remembrance at London's Westminster Abbey yesterday to plant a memorial cross, part of a series of events to commemorate the end of World War One a century ago.

The Field of Remembrance has been held in the grounds of the abbey annually since 1928. Ex-service personnel and members of the public can plant a symbol in memory of those who died.

Some 70,000 crosses are produced by organisers, the Poppy Factory, which are planted on more than 360 plots for regimental and other associations.

Harry, the Duke of Sussex, himself served in the British military, completing two tours in Afghanistan, and is a founder of the Invictus Games, an international paralympic-style event for military personnel wounded in action.

He will join Queen Elizabeth, his father Prince Charles and other senior royals for an annual Festival of Remembrance at London's Royal Albert Hall tomorrow.

On Sunday, the queen and the royal family will attend the annual Remembrance Day Service at The Cenotaph, marking 100 years since the armistice which brought an end to the 1914-18 conflict.
