No new deal from the EU

● The European Union reacted in unison yesterday to news that British Prime Minister Theresa May was coming to demand changes to the Brexit deal the sides agreed just two weeks ago

after 18 months of painstaking talks. "There is no room whatsoever for renegotiation," said Jean-Claude Juncker, the head of the EU's executive Commission.

● Prime Minister Theresa May's government and the European Union should begin planning for a second Brexit referendum because parliament cannot agree on a divorce deal and voters will be asked to break the deadlock, opposition lawmakers said. "The UK is in the middle of a constitutional crisis, which is unparalleled in modern history," said Ian Blackford, SNP leader.

● Britain must revoke its notice to quit the European Union with immediate effect to allow for "serious and profound reflection" by both parliament and the people, former Prime

Minister John Major said. "We need to revoke article 50 with immediate effect. The clock, for the moment, must be stopped," said the former Prime Minister.
