Sterling rises on Brexit hopes

● Sterling rose above \$1.3 yesterday after Britain's opposition Labour Party said it was "highly likely" to back an attempt by lawmakers to prevent a disorderly no-deal Brexit.

With little time left until the 29 March Brexit deadline, there is no agreement in London on how or even whether it should exit the world's biggest trading bloc.

But sterling is gaining as investors buy the currency, betting that a no-deal Brexit can be avoided if parliament exerts greater control over the process.

"Overall the view is parliament doesn't want a hard Brexit and nor does the EU... and if that's the case I don't see how it can happen," said Justin Onuekwusi, a fund manager at Legal & General Investment Management.
