UK summons Iran ambassador, says assurances over oil tanker breached

London.— Britain summoned the Iranian ambassador yesterday to condemn what it said was a clear breach of the assurances it was given over the oil cargo of the tanker *Adrian Darya 1*, which had previously been detained for breaching EU sanctions.

“Iran has shown complete disregard for its own assurances over *Adrian Darya 1*,” foreign minister Dominic Raab said in a statement, accusing Iran of reneging on a promise not to transfer oil from the tanker to Syria.

“This sale of oil to (Syrian President Bashar al-Assad’s) brutal regime is part of a pattern of behaviour by the Government of Iran designed to disrupt regional security.”

Britain said it would raise the issue at the United Nations later this month.

Britain says travellers to EU will have duty-free shopping after no-deal Brexit

London.— Britain yesterday said there would be a return of duty-free shopping for travellers to the European Union if the country leaves the bloc without a deal.

Those going to the EU won’t have to pay UK excise duties on cigarettes and alcohol in a no-deal scenario, Britain’s Treasury said, adding that a bottle of wine bought at London’s Heathrow airport could be up to 2.23 pounds cheaper.

“As we prepare to leave the EU, I’m pleased to be able to back British travellers,” finance minister Sajid Javid said in a statement.

“We want people to enjoy their hard-earned holidays and this decision will help holidaymakers’ cash go that little bit further.”
