Palma.—Majorca is on the hunt for two new Anglican Chaplains to fulfill vacancies in Palma and Pollensa. From January, Majorca will be effectively vicarless! The Reverend David Waller has been promoted to Arch-Deacon and will be vacating his role as Anglican Chaplain in Palma from January. Church wardens both in Pollensa

and in Palma have now begun the task of finding two new chaplains. It is a process that can take as long as nine months.

“Majorca is such a wonderful place I suspect that we will get many candidates for the two jobs,” a Church warden told the *Bulletin*.

38,000 EUROS FOUND BURIED IN MURO FIELD AS PART OF DRUG BUST



THE Guardia Civil yesterday discovered 38,000 euros buried in a field in Muro as part of Operación Bubadu. The latest phase of this particular anti-drugs operation, which covered Barcelona, Huesca and Lleida as well, was carried out the week before last. Thirty-three arrests were made. The seizures included 14.5 kilos of cocaine, one kilo of ecstasy, 3.5 kilos of hashish, simulated weapons and 240,000 euros cash, which includes the money found in Muro.

Bubadu started at the end of 2017 when the Guardia Civil became aware of a group of Moroccans who were importing drugs into Majorca by concealing them under false floors in vehicles. One person was arrested in Puerto Alcudia after seven kilos of cocaine were found.

The week before last there were simultaneous raids on 34 properties in Majorca and on the mainland - 28 private addresses, five garages and one shop.
