Meghan loses latest court battle with UK tabloid newspaper

Meghan, Britain's Duchess of Sussex, has lost the latest skirmish in her privacy lawsuit against a tabloid newspaper, after London's High Court ruled yesterday the paper could amend its case to include details from a recently published biography.

Meghan, wife of Queen Elizabeth's grandson Prince Harry, is suing publisher Associated Newspapers over articles the *Mail on Sunday* printed last year that included parts of a handwritten letter she sent to her estranged father, Thomas Markle, in August

2018. Ahead of a trial due to start next year, the *Mail* had applied for permission to amend its case, arguing that the couple had cooperated with a biography about them, *Finding Freedom*, which was published in August. The paper's lawyers said that showed that Meghan had intended some private details to become public, including the contents of the letter.

The judge, Francesca Kaye, said that while she made no view on the strength of the *Mail's* case, the amendments could not be said to be "unarguable or utterly fanciful".
