## HOME EXCHANGE - a growing trend for travel in Spain

Palma.—The website HomeExchange believes that the pandemic has changed people's travel habits and has given rise to a consolidation of new tourist models such as the exchange of houses. During

the summer, there were almost 200,000 home exchange overnight stays in Spain.

With the return to normality, trends and people's needs are adapting to new circumstances. And as re-

strictions are removed, travellers have become more demanding regarding security. They are seeking more sustainable solutions, but they also want to travel and find a balance with the flexibility that teleworking

has provided. The most popular region of Spain for home exchange over the summer was Catalonia with 51,000 overnight stays. Then came Andalusia (28,000), Valencia with 23,500, and the Balearics

with 10,900. HomeExchange, which promotes a more immersive and responsible tourism model, has found that 80% of Spaniards are aware of this type of travel and that 76% believe that it will be a grow-

ing trend. Women and people under the age of 35 are particularly open to the possibilities. Over the summer, 5,000 new users joined the home exchange community, almost double the number in summer 2020.
