SPAIN'S SEAT ASKS UNVACCINATED WORKERS TO EAT SEPARATELY IN BARCELONA CANTEEN

Madrid.—Volkswagen's Spanish car maker SEAT has recommended unvaccinated and vaccinated employees sit separately in its canteen at its plant outside Barcelona to protect workers and ensure operational activity, the company said yesterday.

The move, which involves having a separate section for workers who have not had a COVID-19 vaccine, has been in place for the past month, a SEAT spokesperson told Reuters.

The initiative is one the first of its kind implemented in Spain.

"A few weeks ago, it was decided with the

agreement of union representatives, to set up areas within the company canteens to protect unvaccinated workers," SEAT said in a statement. "The areas for those who are unvaccinated have the strictest COVID measures to protect their health."

It said these were recommendations and the company could not force people to eat separately. The car manufacturer said the objective of the measure was to protect all workers, both unvaccinated and vaccinated, as well as to "guarantee the operational activity of the company".

Plastic cutlery is given the elbow

London.—Single-use plastic plates and cutlery and polystyrene cups could all be banned in England as the British government seeks to eliminate all avoidable plastic waste, it said yesterday.

England uses 1.1 billion single-use plates and 4.25 billion items of single-use cutlery, most of which are plastic, per year, but only 10% are recycled upon disposal, it said.

Under proposals in a 12-week public consultation, businesses and consumers will need to move towards more sustainable alternatives.

"QUEEN" IS BACK 100 YEARS LATER

WHEN the flagship of the the Royal Navy, the aircraft carrier *Queen Elizabeth*, drops anchor in the Bay of Palma later this month...it will be almost 100 years to the day since her predecessor paid her first visit to the port. The "old" *Queen Elizabeth* was a battleship armed with 15

inch guns and was a veteran of the First World War and the Battle of her Jutland. Like her modern-day counterpart she was considered to be state of the art. The battleship, with a crew of at least 1,000, made four visits to Majorca, but only one to Palma.

The other three were to Polensa. Her visit to the port of Palma took place in 1920.



Like her modern-day successor it was part of a show of force by the Royal Navy in the Mediterranean. The aircraft carrier has now replaced the battleship as the most powerful war-

ship afloat. The carrier, *Queen Elizabeth*, is coming to Palma after a long deployment to the Far East. Aboard, she has 17 F35 stealth jets along with various helicopters. She is expected to be accompanied on her visit to Palma by support ships and possibly frigates and destroyers. Palma has always been popular with the Royal Navy.
